Will China build a solar power station in space by 2030?

Back in 2021, we reported that the tests for the Chinese space solar power plant, which will take place in Chongqing city in Southwestern China, would lead to constructing a huge 1-megawatt solar power station in space by 2030. Now, China has brought forward the solar power plant space station launch.

What is China's largest solar plant?

China continues its relentless expansion of solar power capacity, now home to the world's largest solar plant. The 2.2 gigawatt facility spans an area of over 25 square kilometers in the Gobi desert. This \$3 billion flagship project demonstrates the epic scale of renewable infrastructure developing worldwide.

How much does a solar power plant cost in China?

A solar power plant in China costs 325 million yuan (\$47.93 million). This is the cost for the power plant that was installed in the Kubuqi Desert, which is a key project in the Kubuqi Desert Economic Pilot Zone, planned and built by Dalad Banner.
