

How is electricity produced in French Polynesia?

Electricity production in French Polynesia is still heavily dependent on fossil fuels despite the development of renewable energy sources (REn). Electricity production and consumption are unevenly distributed over the territory as they are correlated with the geo- graphical distribution of the population.

Who created the first electricity company in French Polynesia?

The first public electrical energy distribution company in French Polynesia was created in 1910 by Charles Ducorron. It was succeeded by the Etablissements Martin et fils, who held the concession for providing electricity in Tahiti.

Is biomass a source of electricity in French Polynesia?

Traditional biomass - the burning of charcoal, crop waste, and other organic matter - is not included. This can be an important source in lower-income settings.
