Do I need a power outlet in Costa Rica?

The two most important things to note with the power outlets in Costa Rica is that they are Type A and B. If you come from a country that uses these plug types, you will not need an adapter.

What type of electrical outlets does Costa Rica use?

Costa Rica mainly uses two types of electrical outlets: Type A and Type B outlets. Type A outlets have two flat parallel pins, while Type B outlets have two flat parallel pins and a grounding pin. To ensure that you can charge your devices without any issues, it is recommended to bring a universal travel adapter.

Where can I buy a voltage converter in Costa Rica?

These converters can be purchased at electronics stores, travel supply shops, or online. In addition to voltage converters, you may also need adapters to ensure your plugs fit into the electrical outlets in Costa Rica. What type of power plugs are used in Costa Rica?

In Costa Rica, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type A and type B are used. The standard voltage is 120 V at a frequency of 60 Hz. The power sockets in Costa Rica are of type A and B. The standard voltage is 120 V at a frequency of 60 Hz. Check your need for a power plug (travel) adapter in Costa Rica.

Do device plugs work in Costa Rica?

Most device plugs will work with the outlet types in Costa Rica. Also, the voltage in Costa Rica is the same as in North America. Please note: an adapter will be needed if your device plug has a grounding pin and you are trying to use a Type A outlet. For this reason, we always recommend traveling with a universal travel adapter.
