

Why have the UK government increased offshore wind subsidies?

Will the government invest in offshore wind projects next year?

There is the potential for the government to attract a record level of private investment in offshore wind projects next year, with at least 10 projects likely to be eligible, able to power 8.5 million homes each year and reduce the UK's need for gas by 39%. The framework they've set out today is a significant step forward in securing this.

The majority of the funding will be available to develop offshore wind power, which the Labour government says it wants to quadruple by 2030. The extra money has been broadly welcomed by the renewables industry, but there are warnings that without other changes, any new projects may not be delivered in time.

Will the UK increase offshore wind capacity by 2030?

The UK government wants to increase UK offshore wind capacity almost fourfold to 50GW by 2030, requiring rapid development of projects.
